### Time Line of Duties:

### June

- Attended initial Spaghetti Supper chair meeting
- Reserved rotary space for week before the supper. Call (978)369-6136. Town allows one week reservation only.
- Published "save the date" info in the Buzz at end of previous school year so that people could get it in their calendars early NOTE: Buzz press releases are due at noon on the Friday before publication. We submitted the press releases with the graphic, which drew attention to the article.

Mosquito press releases are due at noon on the Monday before publication.

### July/August

- Committee chairs met to create task list. We did this to clearly communicate to committee members their responsibilities, time frames and how each task connected to others.
- We undertook a complete redesign of the Spaghetti Supper logo this year, since the previous look was in place for many years. We also tried to incorporate color into posters and flyers, but managed to defray costs by outputting to local desktop printers or securing in-kind donations. All artwork is included on the disk and may be used for subsequent years if desired. This also included redesign of the raffle tickets, where we streamlined layout to create more space for the users to write and fewer fields to fill out.

### September

- Contacted Publicity Committee members
- 9/4 Submitted press release to the Buzz
- 9/7 Submitted press release to the Mosquito
- 9/10 Held committee meeting & allowed members to select tasks.
   NOTE: At least one member should be proficient in computer layout & design.
- Color flyers given to 2 committee members for posting around town.
- 9/12 Completed layout of newsletter. Some articles & info were submitted by other committees (Raffle, Waitstaff), but most of the writing & all of the layout are done by Publicity. The Supper chair contacted committee chairs to submit info. Try to start on the newsletter early, as it's a significant amount of work. Printed at Staples, because it needed to be done over a weekend.
- 9/13 80 copies of newsletter delivered to ticket committee, to be distributed to 6<sup>th</sup> graders with ticket packets.
- 9/14 Met with Kerry Lyons in Central Supply (school's copy center). She agreed to copy flyers in black & white for distribution to the whole school population later in the week. Discussed deadlines, design, etc of program. She also made B&W copies of the large posters & laminated them for our sandwich boards. The school did this at no cost to us, and donated the white paper for the flyers & the program.

- 9/14 Ordered color sandwich board posters from printer. (School could only produce B&W). We used color posters for sandwich boards at the rotary & school entrance. All others B&W.
- 9/14 Submitted press release to the Mosquito
- 9/18 Submitted press release to the Buzz
- 9/18 Sandwich boards at school entrance & on 2 private lawns in town center placed on display.
- 9/21 Submitted press release to the Mosquito
- 9/28 Submitted press release to the Mosquito
- 9/29 Sandwich board placed in rotary

### October

- 10/1 Colored paper for program cover delivered to school copy shop. Text & prototype of program delivered to copy shop.
- 10/2 600 programs, compiled & jogged, picked up from copy shop. Folded by committee members over the weekend.
- 10/2 Created "thank you" posters for display at supper. One listed & thanked businesses & individuals who donated to the meal itself, and the other thanked each raffle donor.
- 10/6 Delivered "thank you" posters & programs to cafeteria during setup.
- 10/7 Removed sandwich boards from placements & returned boards to owners

### Changes/Suggestions:

What went well: We had a large committee (3 co-chairs plus 7 other members). Everyone chose jobs suited to their skills, and were great about offering to help each other. As a result, all the tasks were completed efficiently & promptly. It was also extremely helpful to have a graphic artist on the committee.

What bombed: Nothing!



### Calling all Sixth Graders as Wait Staff

### Question:

What are the expectations for ticket sales?

#### Answer:

Sixth graders should contact friends, family, and neighbors as soon as possible to sell dinner and raffle tickets.

#### PLACEMENT OF SIGNS IN ROTARY

(Policy Adopted by Board of Selectmen May 7, 1991)

(See section 10.3.1 of the General Bylaws)

- 1. The sign shall be no larger than 2 feet by 3 feet.
- The purpose of the sign is to promote a local event of general interest to the Carlisle community.
- The sign is not politically partisan in nature. (Signs such as a notice of town meeting dates or those urging voters to vote are acceptable.)
- The sign is concise in it's wording so as not to provide a significant detraction from the attention of passing automobile drivers.
- The period that the sign will be in place is specified. (Typically, permission will be given for periods not longer than one week with possible renewal for a second week.)
- 6. Only one sign will be displayed during the period requested.
