Spaghetti Supper Committee Report Form (2009)

Committee Name: Sauce

Chairs: Lori Jiménez and Liz Jewell

Summary of Responsibilities: The Sauce Committee is responsible for procuring most of the sauce ingredients and the spaghetti, arranging to have them stored, and making the sauce the night before the Spaghetti Supper.

Detailed Description of Responsibilities:

- Contact Pastene to ask for a donation of spaghetti, sauce, olive oil and parmesan cheese.
- 2. Contact various other vendors to ask for a meat donation. The meat is more expensive than the other ingredients and we had trouble confirming a donation until about 3 weeks before the event. Many vendors that donated in previous years cited the bad economy as the reason they were not able to donate this year. Concord Prime and Fish generously donated all 50 pounds of beef on the first call, and then we got confirmation of another 20 pounds from Trader Joe's. We ended up with 20 pounds more than the recipe called for and we used it all in the sauce.
- Contact Goshen Hill Garlic (Sellew family), who has donated all the garlic the past few years.
- 4. We brought our own wine.
- After the donations are confirmed, arrange a pick-up date with Pastene and arrange storage of the sauce and spaghetti with Sue Robichaud.
- Arrange with the Purchasing Committee to get the rest of the ingredients (herbs, vegetables). Pick-up the meat no more than 2 hours before making the sauce.
- On the night before the Spaghetti Supper, pick-up the meat and start making the sauce at 2 p.m. in the cafeteria. We finished making the sauce around 6 p.m. and left when it was fully cooled around 8:30 p.m.

Notes:

- The sauce cools faster in the hotel pans than in the pickle barrels so cool the first batch in the pickle barrels and the second batch in the hotel pans.
- The recipe calls for 50 pounds of meat. We used 70 pounds of meat and 3 fewer gallons of plain sauce and it was not overly meaty. There were 3 pickle barrels of meat sauce left. There was ½ a pan of vegetarian sauce left.
- We cooked the meat in the large vat, not on the cooktop as stated in the recipe. After cooking the meat and wine, we added the bags of plain sauce to the vat.
- 4. We never got an accurate count of how many meals were served.
